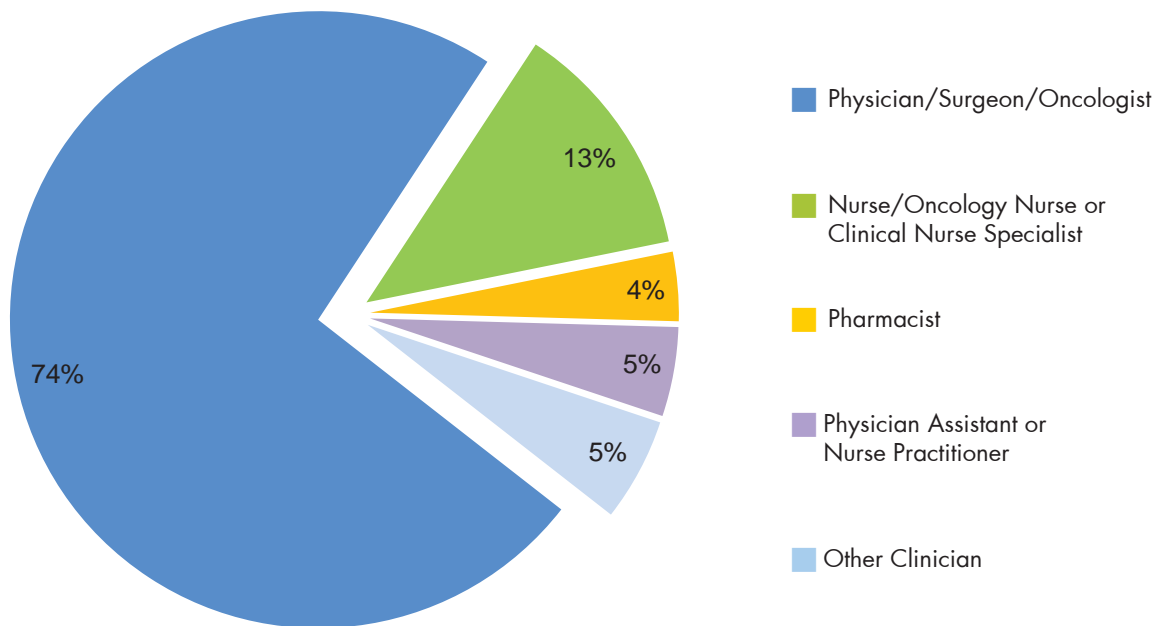

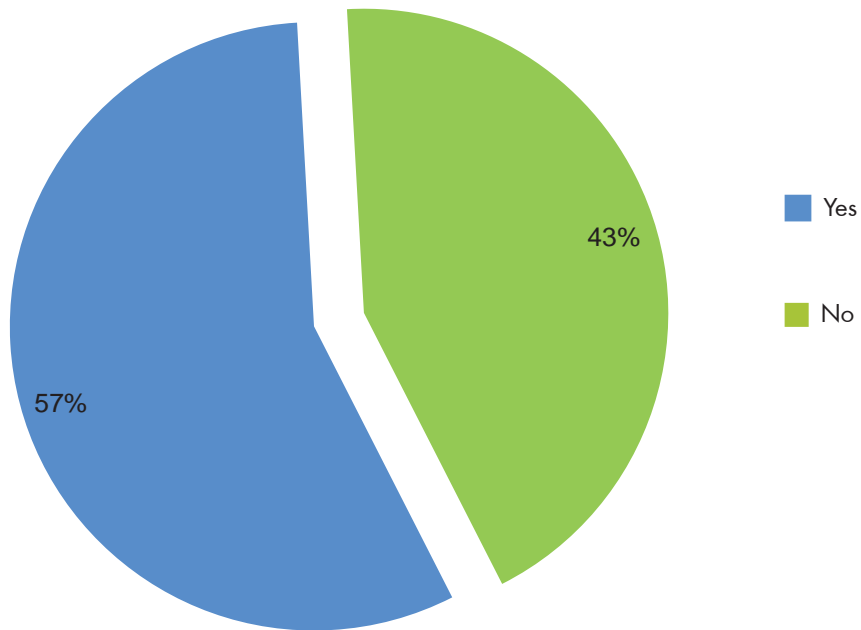

Distribution of Respondent Types (n = 1,326)

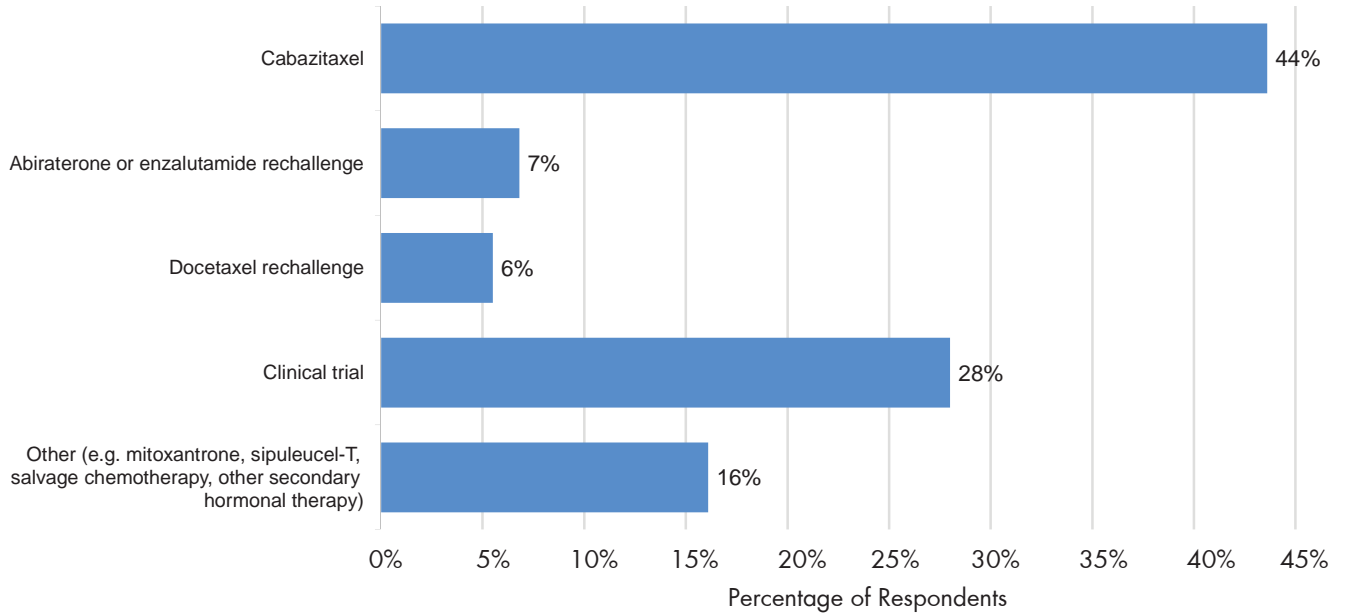

Q1. Do you treat patients with metastatic Castration-Resistant Prostate Cancer (mCRPC)? (n = 1,326)



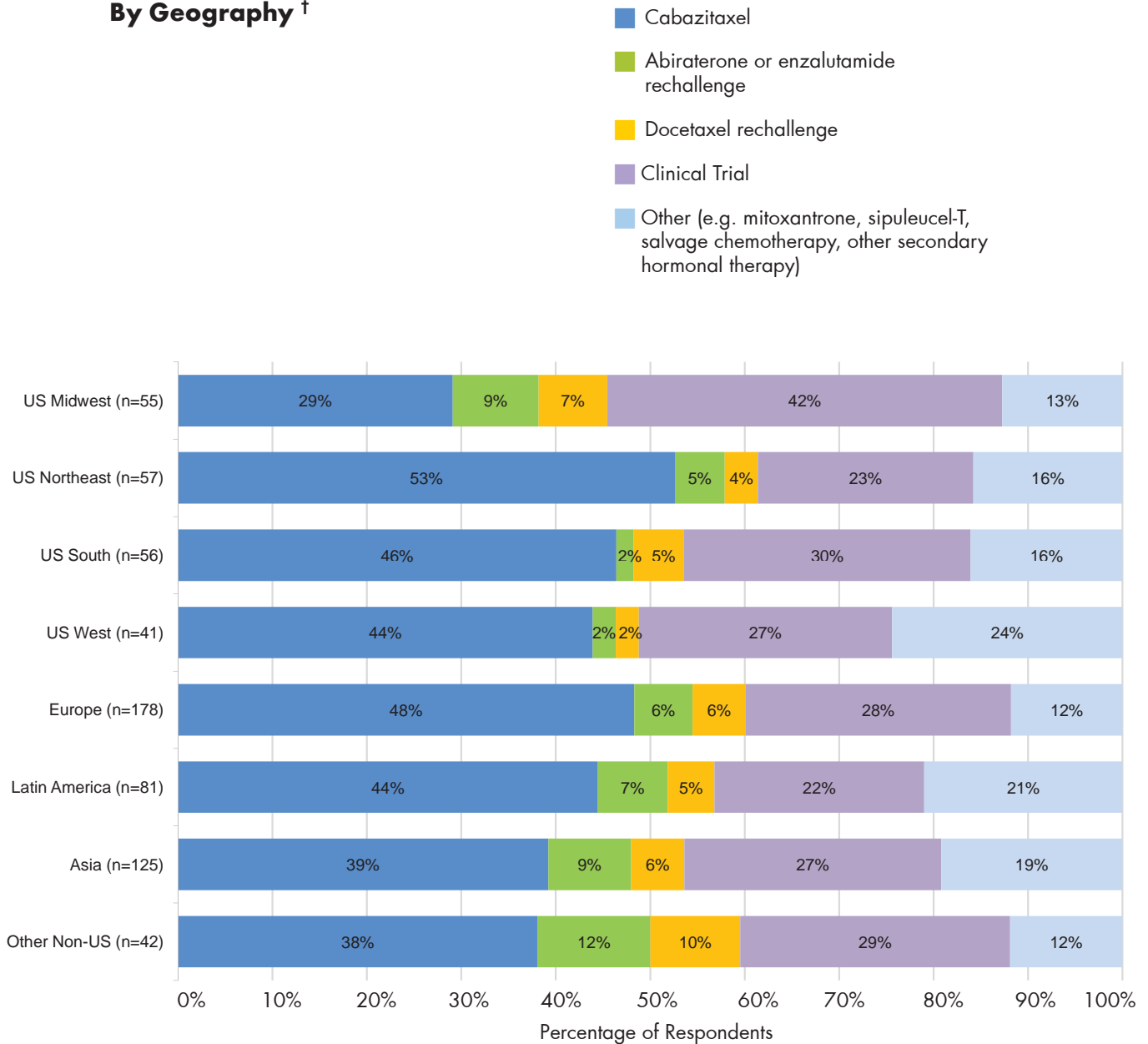

Q2. For patients with symptomatic mCRPC who have progressed on docetaxel, abiraterone and enzalutamide (in any order), what would be your preferred treatment option?

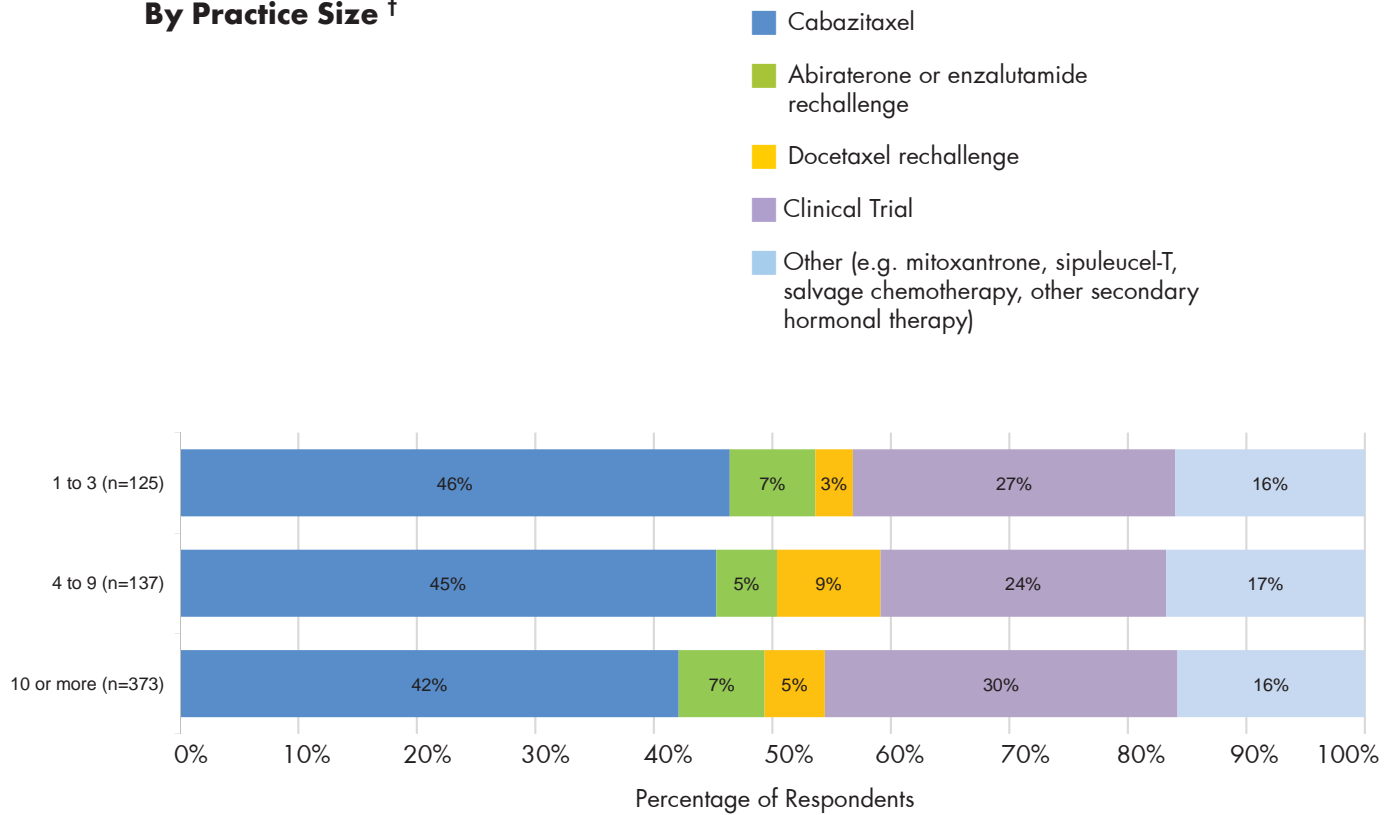
By Geography †

Q2. For patients with symptomatic mCRPC who have progressed on docetaxel, abiraterone and enzalutamide (in any order), what would be your preferred treatment option?

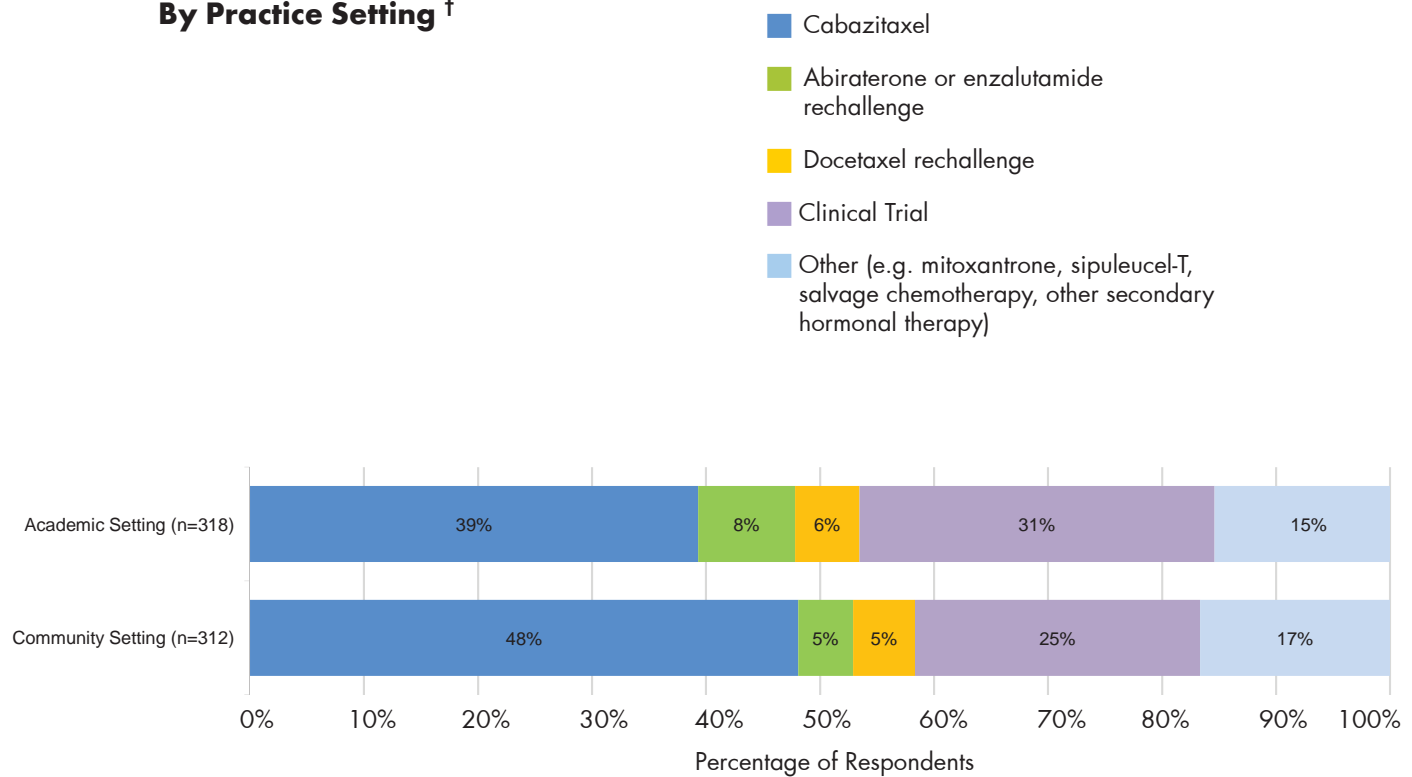
By Practice Size †

By Practice Setting †

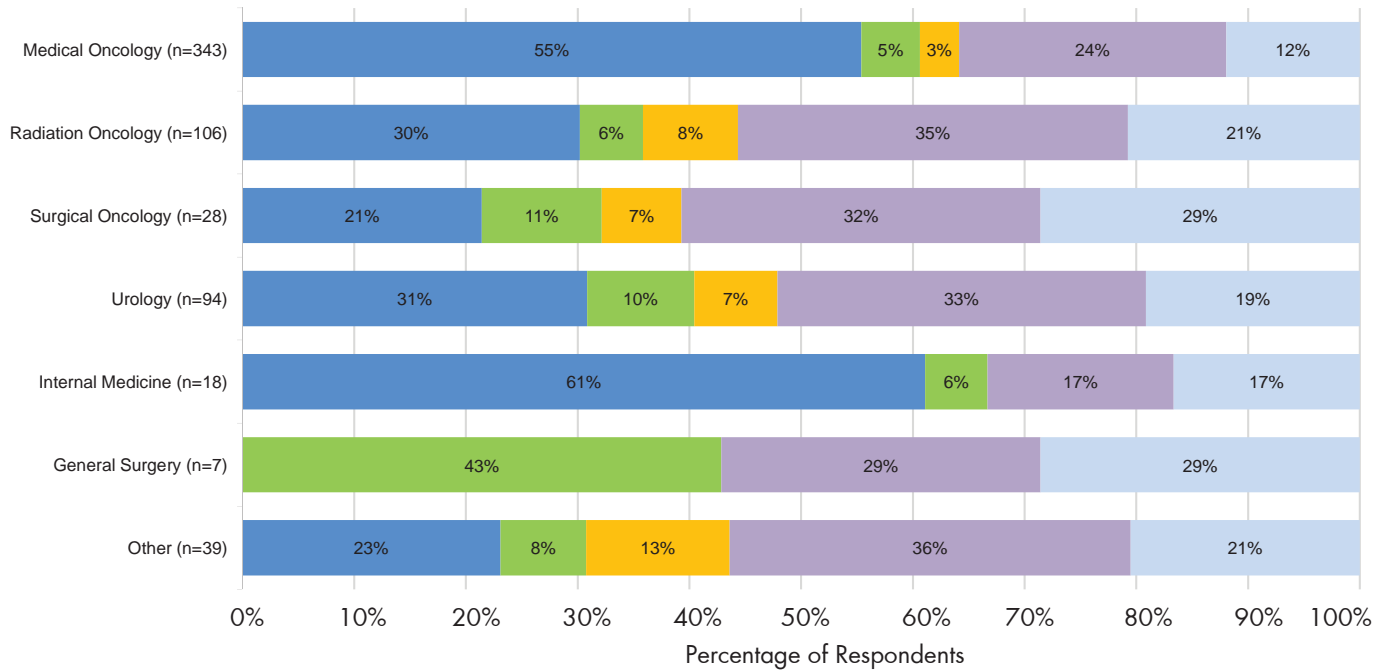
